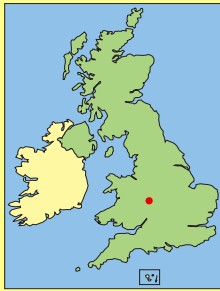
Stondon is 35 miles north of London. The Museum is located on the A600, 4 miles from Hitchin, Hertfordshire. There are brown tourist signs showing the way to the Museum.

Open: 7 days a week from 10.00am to 5.00pm. Phone for opening times at Christmas/New Year. Admission: £3 adults; children £1; family ticket £7. Parking (coaches by appointment only). Coffee shop, toilets, picnic area. Special rates for groups. The Curator advises that the list opposite is incomplete, as at least another 100 vehicles have been added since the list was given to us! Lots to look forward to and there is a garden centre there as well.

One of the country's largest private collections of cars: a total of around 350 exhibits of motorcycles, fire engines, army vehicles from the early 1900s to the 1980s, even a Russian SAM missile! These are displayed in five separate halls: hall one, the old timers; hall two ,the forties and fifties; hall three ,the sixties and seventies; hall four, fire engines, tractors, military items, buses and American cars; hall five has an exclusive collection of Rolls-Royce and Bentley motor cars. There is also a replica of Captain Cook's ship, *The Endeavour*.

Several years ago, Autoworld, as the Collection was then known, had to close for various reasons. Recently the remaining Collection has been made available for public viewing but only on a group basis; minimum group size is ten people. Guided tours can be arranged if required. The Collection comprises some 70 cars, 45 of which are on display. The vehicles are all of a high standard and include a number of rare models.

There is access for the disabled and also toilets. Parking is permitted and the facilities of The Mill House Hotel (Tel. 0121 459 5800), which is adjacent to the Museum, are available. Another major tourist attraction, the Cadbury World exhibition, is nearby.

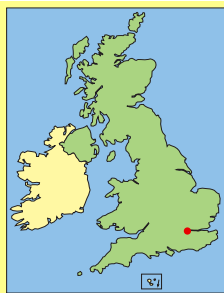

The Museum tries to reflect current developments by constantly adapting its displays and introducing new ones, so bear this in mind. At present 'The Gallery of the Modern World' is being prepared. Open: 10.00am until 6.00pm every day except Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. There's a gift shop, toilets, disabled access, restaurant, picnic area and book shop, but no parking facilities. Over one million people visit the Museum annually so it's best to arrive as early as possible for your visit.

Land transport section exhibits will always vary relative to the particular programme of exhibitions, but there are normally several vehicles on display at the Science Museum.

We suggest that you also check page 149, the Science Museum, Wroughton, near Swindon, Wiltshire. This houses the vast majority of the land transport exhibits of the Science Museum and contains access details for that site.

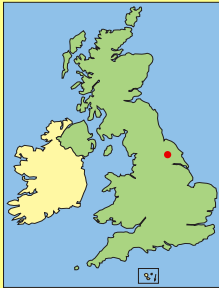
Exhibits may include:

JET 1, the world's first gas turbine car developed by Rover and based on the Rover 75. The engine develops 200hp at 40,000rpm and uses a gallon of paraffin every 4 miles.



The Collection can be found 10 miles northeast of York.

Admission: £2.50.



Access to the Camp is off the A64 York to Scarborough road at the junction of the A169 to Pickering. Eden Camp is 18 miles from York.

Admission: adults £3.50; children and concessions £2.50, with a £1.00 reduction for groups over 10. Note that during term-time, school visits may be in progress.

As the address signifies, this is a World War II ex-prisoner of war camp which has steadily enlarged its visitor attractions to embrace all aspects of World War I. In 1998, Eden Camp won the English Tourist Board Visitor Attraction of the Year Award. The various aspects of WWII are covered in detail: the U-boat menace, Bomber Command, and so on. At the Camp is a military vehicle section which is constantly growing. Disabled access is good, and parking is free. Refreshments are served in the 'prisoners' canteen,' 'officers' mess' and the 'Garrison Cinema Bar.' There is a two-part assault course for younger visitors and one for Tiny Tot commandos. Open: between 15th January and 13th February, Mondays to Fridays from 10.00am to 5.00pm, last admission 4.00pm. From 14th February the camp is open 7 days a week until 23rd December.
